## Obama and Climate

In my work I determined that of the 1218 meteorological (temperature) data stations only 196 are located in rural areas. Of that 196 only 136 had worthy data. For those 136 the temperature had not changed in the past 100 years. There are 6 such rural sites in the western portion of Virginia and those six are the most complete sets of data of all 1218. The average for those six showed a temperature decrease for the period from 1900 to 2011 of -0.01 °F/century.
